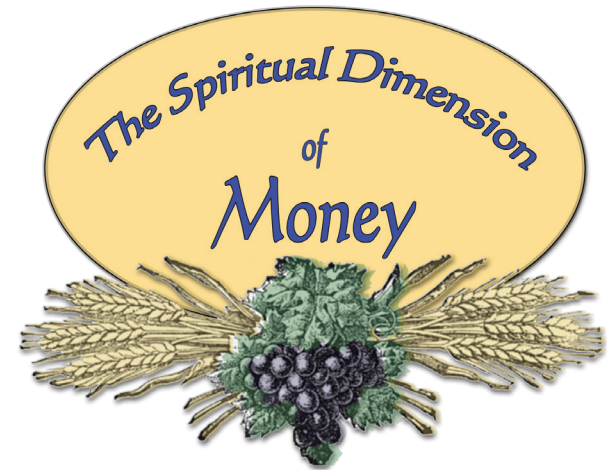
From I-40/75 take Exit 374 (Lovell Road). Go South

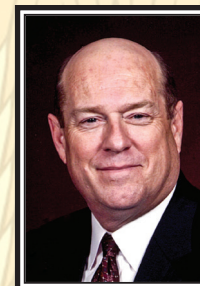

Why are we so afraid of money in the church? Why is it that pastors are so reluctant to talk about it? Why are most laity so glad when the pastor DOESN'T talk about it? According to an interview in Leadership Journal, *"The chief inhibitor to generosity isn't greed; it's fear. Fear of not having enough. And the only remedy for fear is trust. Trust and generosity walk hand in hand."*
