Tucked up in a mountain hollow in Bishop, VA is a small church with a very big heart. Alexander United Methodist Church, a part of the Bishop Charge in the Tazewell District, serves the people of an old mining camp community. Built by an Italian stonemason in the 1940's from stone mined from the area, the church has weathered floods, economic downturns, and the harsh reality of living in the rural southwest Virginia area.

With the leadership of Rev. Neal Hammons, who is serving in his first appointment, the Alexander UMC congregation are making a big difference in the lives of many of the poor and underserved. Over 200 meals a month are provided through their Bread of Life program where volunteers serve meals weekly at the church as well as send home food for children to eat on the weekends. With many residents in the area not able to walk to the church during inclement weather (most of the recipients do not have vehicles) Alexander UMC will be delivering meals to them in their homes.
