Legacy Sunday: Sowing for a Harvest for Future Ministry

Generational Shift:

Every year greater numbers of the "Greatest Generation" and "Baby Boomers" are leaving our fellowship for a greater promise of things to come. In addition to incredible testimonies of sacrifice and service, they also leave a hole in the annual support of the work of the local church. Finance committees, trustees and staff cope with shrinking budgets while also working harder to reach more and more of the lost or needy. Faced with the reality of a significantly aging membership, most American churches, experts point to this generational shift increasing even more rapidly beginning around 2018, when the rate of deaths in our country increases.

The Dilemma:

The dilemma for our local church leaders is to continue "to serve Christ by setting disciples on fire with Spirit-filled, risk-taking love for all

God's children" while increasing budgets meet a continued and dramatic decrease in the faithful contribution base. For the layperson and clergy who possess a vision for their church to continue to be relevant, there seems to be only two options to consider: trim ministry which eventually results in the decline of the effectiveness of the local church or **proactively seek a new funding base**. Recently Roger Redding and Paul Bowman preached on "Legacy Sunday" at Munsey Memorial in Johnson City. Spurred by the dogged determination of Church Trustee John Anderson (who is also a Foundation board member) and the leadership of Chair John Taylor, the Endowment and Planned Giving Ministry Committee carefully constructed a strategic plan to educate and elevate the importance of charitable estate planning in their church. Understanding not only the pressing financial needs to reach "the least of these" through vital ministries that are at the heart of Methodism, Munsey's leadership is proactively creating an awareness of what gifts



through bequests, trusts or real estate can accomplish not only today but for many years. With helpful information like the Foundation's <u>Personal Information Record Book</u>, an awareness of estate planning is shared with church attendees as individuals not only think about their own legacy and the impact their gift can have on current and future ministry.
