When it comes down to it, here I am looking back on the most sacred journey. My ministry began “yesterday” up on this stage, and it is ending today on this very stage. Did I go far? It seems like it was only one long day, in a thousand different ways.

I wonder if I took being a minister/chaplain too seriously and missed the trees in the forest. One minute I am pulling up in front of Keith Church in Athens, and the next minute I am feeling Tennessee Ernie Ford’s “Sixteen Tons” back in 1955.

Yes, I can call my ministry weighty. God chose me to be his servant within churches, hospitals, and hospice care. I followed his will, beginning my journey at Bangor Seminary. Next, I was blessed by Bishop Chamberlain and told to “go out into the world.” I didn’t go far, just down the road to Athens, TN. I was their new Associate Pastor. I remember thinking what an honor it was to have my office within such a sacred place, a very humbling place.

I got to know a lot of good folks there. Those that had family and those that, for various reasons, lived alone. Our radio broadcast on Sunday morning was particularly important to those that were alone. They had a friend “out there” that remembered them every Sunday, and I believe that was life-giving. When I visited them I asked the same questions as the Bishop is now asking me. “What was your life all about?” Sometimes, the person wept in appreciation that someone had asked them that question.

“Well, what was it all about, Ambrose?” During this journey, was I a good Father, servant, teacher? Was I present to my family and to those I had been led to minister to? Was I a good minister, chaplain, and caregiver? What kind of a person was I then, and what kind of person am I now? And the big question, “Did it matter?” I don’t know yet.

Verizon, the telephone company we all know, politely asked my wife Sandra if she could relocate to their corporate headquarters in Fort Worth, TX. They gave us two days to decide. We told them “Yes” right away. I was excited because I knew there was no doubt this next step was part of my path.

Opening 15 or 20 hospital room doors a day was quite a challenge. I never knew what I would find inside. For the most part, not many of them cared that a Chaplain had come to their door. Some said it was “bad luck” or they just didn’t have time. Within the emergency and trauma units and ICUs, people were more responsive to a visit. Friday and Saturday nights were busiest, and I realized I had a gift for ministering in these departments. Helicopter pilots would rush in, still wearing full flight gear. They would be carrying, between them on a stretcher, someone’s life – young, middle-aged, or elderly. Watching a Code Blue (patient dying) was like watching a ballet, a fine-tuned set of gears that harmonized to save a life. I stood with them, a symbol that told them all, “God is here, too.” Hospice was a much slower kind of care. I used the time to help educate and prepare the patient and the family to meet the Holy Spirit as the end of life approached for them.

Maybe retirement is a time to think of all the adventures of my life and to sort it out a bit. Maybe I will try to answer the question of who I was and who I have become. And maybe it’s a time to begin to think of the remaining time I have left on earth and how to live it best. Is it going to feel like one day?

 Favorite Scripture: Proverbs 3:5-6

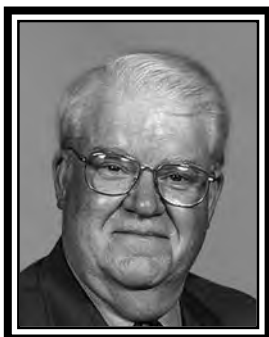

BISHOP MACK B. STOKES

1911 – 2012

Bishop Mack B. Stokes, age 100, of Perdido Key, FL, died peacefully in his sleep on November 21, 2012. Bishop Stokes was born in Wonson, Korea, on December 21, 1911. He grew up in a missionary home with three brothers, all of whom became Methodist preachers. Mack graduated from the Seoul Foreign High School at age 16. He received his A.B. from Asbury College, his B.D. from Duke University, and his Ph.D. from Boston University. For 31 years, he was a professor at Emory University's Candler School of Theology, where he was Parker Professor of Systematic Theology and Associate Dean. He taught thousands of young preachers, who became his friends for life. He was elected to the episcopacy of The United Methodist Church in 1972 and served as Bishop in Mississippi until 1980. During this service, he led a successful effort to merge the African-American and White Methodist conferences. Mack was a distinguished scholar - a great philosopher and Personalist. He authored more than 10 books and numerous articles. One of his books, *Major United Methodist Beliefs*, has had multiple printings and has been translated into several languages. However, he was best known as a humble servant of Christ, having preached around the world for more than 70 years. In June 1941, Mack married Ada Rose Yow of Henderson, NC. They did everything together for 67 years, until she passed away in 2008. When Mack was asked whether Rose was his first love, he responded, "Oh, no, she was my only love." In 2008, Mack and Rose established the "Bishop Mack B. and Rose Stokes Chair in Theology" at Emory's Candler School of Theology. Mack continued his life-long service to Emory University for more than 70 years, having also been a member of the Board of Trustees since 1972. Mack is survived by two sons, Arch Yow Stokes of Perdido Key, FL (Maggie), and Marion Boyd Stokes III of Atlanta, GA; seven grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; numerous nieces and nephews; his brother-in-law, Jensen Yow; and his sisters-in-law, Alda Stokes, 102, and Marilyn Stokes. He was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Rose; his precious daughter, Elsie Pauline; and his three brothers, Lem, Jim, and Charlie Stokes. Celebration-of-Life Memorial Services were held in Pensacola, FL; in Atlanta, GA; and at Lake Junaluska, NC.



CHARLES M. BRYAN

1927 – 2012

Charles M. Bryan, age 84 of Maryville, died Tuesday, September 18, 2012, at Tennova Hospice in Halls. Born in Chattanooga, he was preceded in death by his parents, Warren and Jessie Bryan, and brothers Morris and Edward.

He was licensed and/or certified in clinical psychology, teaching-education, engineering (radio), and an ordained deacon and elder in the United Methodist Church. Dr. Solomon is listed in the volumes: Who's Who in the South & Southwest, Who's Who in Education, Who's Who in the United Methodist Church (and others). His teaching career spanned several colleges and universities throughout the South, with his final teaching assignment at Emory University. He was author of several books and numerous articles for professional journals. This background found expression in workshops, seminars, and conferences at various colleges, religious, and business organizations throughout the country. 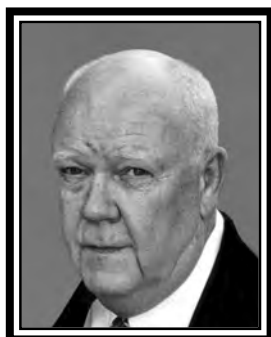
CHARLES MICHAEL WATSON

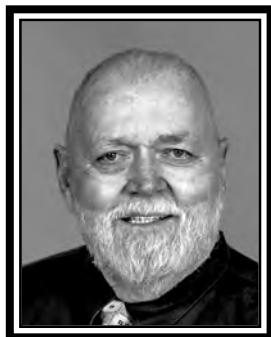

DOROTHY RICHARDSON BEDWELL

1919 – 2012

Dorothy Richardson Bedwell was born in Raleigh, NC, on May 5, 1919, to Augustus and Mamie Byrum ... the 9th of 10 children. She died June 9, 2012, in Knoxville, TN.

To tell our Mother's story, please let us use her own words – words that she carefully put on paper to each of us four children as part of a tribute to our Dad, the Reverend H. Powell Richardson. "Never, in my wildest imagination, did I think, when I walked into the little church on Portsmouth Island that summer evening, that the student minister I met

would become my best friend, husband, and the father of you, our children. He was interning from Duke Divinity School on the Ocracoke-Portsmouth Charge and was at Portsmouth to teach a course on Worship." This chance meeting resulted in Dorothy's conversion to a life of spreading God's love, power, and compassion. Before that week was over, she had committed to work with Powell in setting up the Vacation Bible School for the children of Ocracoke Island on North Carolina's rugged Outer Banks.

Dorothy's early life had been one of comfort, whereas Powell's had been one of hardship. Following their marriage in 1941, Powell received his first appointment to the Holston Conference's East Tazewell Circuit. This was a life that was easy for him (having grown up in the hills of Southwest Virginia). But the new lifestyle presented many challenges for Dorothy. She quickly transitioned to the simpler life of living in the country, with no parsonage and few creature comforts. Eight churches on the circuit meant individual services were held throughout the week. Opening and cleaning the churches, planning the activities, visiting the sick, helping with music, teaching Sunday School – all these duties and many more were efficiently handled by the "team" of Dorothy and Powell.

Again, using Dorothy's own words: "A drive over the circuit was 25 miles, so most of Powell's \$1,000 annual salary went for gas. Together, we visited people in their homes wherever they were – sometimes in the yard stirring off a big pot of apple butter or a vat of cane molasses, possibly in the fields planting or harvesting, or in the Fall at the butchering site working up their year's supply of pork."

Her early years of working side-by-side with her pastor/husband gave Dorothy skills that carried on throughout the remainder of her life. After Powell died at the age of 42, she remained active in church work. She joined the staff of Church Street United Methodist in Knoxville as Membership Coordinator. This position allowed her to once more "visit the people in their homes wherever they were." Her development of visitation programs brought elderly members and shut-ins back into fold of the church. Later, following a second marriage to Willard Bedwell and a move back to her native North Carolina, Dorothy joined the staff of Centenary United Methodist Church (in New Bern) and was instrumental in setting up training programs for teachers – with emphasis on the many small rural churches throughout coastal North Carolina. Even after her final move – to Shannondale Retirement Community in Knoxville – she continued to teach Sunday school, remain active in United Methodist Women, and spread God's word through her love and compassion for everyone she encountered. At the age of 93, this good and faithful servant's work was complete.



MARGARET ANNE DRAKE BRYAN

For a pastor's wife, her work is cut out for her. In the case of one special lady, she fulfilled at least three distinct callings: pastor's wife, schoolteacher, and caregiver.

Mrs. Mary Deane Allen Shugart was born June 7, 1918, to Claude Erman and Naomi Estelle (Corbett) Allen in a large, white frame farmhouse in rural Jefferson County, TN. She was raised at Seahorn's Chapel United Methodist Church; her father helped to finance and build the present church, which dates back to the early 1940s. As a child she dreamed of one day being a Rockette. Despite her lofty dreams, she graduated valedictorian from White Pine High School in 1936. She attended Maryville College, graduated cum laude in 1940,

and earned a double major in English and French.

Her teaching career began in the one room schoolhouse at Walland, TN. Many of her students walked, often barefoot, across the mountain from Cades Cove. The next year she found a teaching position closer to home at Chestnut Grove. It was during this second year of teaching that she went to revival and heard a handsome, eloquent graduate of Candler School of Theology at Emory University named J. A. "Jimmy" Shugart. A courtship ensued, and on November 19, 1943, the young couple was married by the Rev. E. A. "Ed" Shugart – Mary Deane's new father-in-law.

During more than 48 years of marriage, they served many pastorates and had two children: Jim Shugart (1944) and Claudine Shugart (1946). After about 10 years of being a housewife, Mary Deane resumed her career. She worked wherever her husband was assigned, teaching high school French, Spanish, and English. Her father, Dr. John Crisman Hawk, a member of the Holston Annual Conference from Blountville, TN, went to China as a missionary with his wife Jean Buchanan Hawk of Glade Spring, VA, in 1905, serving there until 1944. Jean lived in China until the age of 17, when she traveled by steamer and locomotive to her mother's family home at Keywood near Glade Spring. She entered Randolph-Macon Women's College in Lynchburg, VA, in the fall of 1932. Within the next 3 years she met and became engaged to H. Olin Troy, who

at that time was pastor of the six-point circuit which included the Buchanan family home church at Hebron.

Jean and Olin were married on July 29, 1936, and began their life together sharing pastorates throughout the Holston Conference over the next 42 years. That journey took them to churches in Johnson City, Pennington Gap, Chattanooga, Marion, Bristol, Knoxville, Morristown, and Radford. During these years they also raised a family of three sons -- Bill Troy of Knoxville, Jim Troy of Shipman, VA, and Henry Troy of Denver. It was a busy, lively, full life that Jean led.

Throughout her life she was very active in her local church. In addition to fulfilling all the many responsibilities incumbent upon her as part of a clergy couple, she was especially interested and active in youth and young adult ministries. At different times, she also served on conference commissions on Christian vocations and ministerial education and was named a delegate to both Southeast Jurisdiction and General Conference sessions.

She had a particular passion for the work of United Methodist Women, serving offices at the local, district, conference, and national levels. In 1964 she was elected to the United Methodist Board of Global Ministries, where for two quadrennia she represented the Women's Division of the national church. As vice-chair of the Board's World Division, she traveled throughout the world on behalf of United Methodist missions.

Jean's concern for missions was a natural outgrowth of her upbringing in China. So, too, was her commitment to ecumenical work. She was very involved in Church Women United, serving two years as Tennessee State President and nine years on the National Board of Managers. This was at a time in the 1950s and 1960s when the organization carried on important interracial women's work throughout the South.

Jean shared with all China missionaries and their families an eternal bond with that country and its people. After Olin died in 1977, she had a chance to return on a tour sponsored by the US/China Peoples Friendship Association (USCPFA). Soon she was asked to become a tour leader herself and this led to an exciting new venture in her life. For the next 17 years, until age 81, she led 25 USCPFA tours to China. She also organized the Chattanooga chapter of USCPFA, was elected national secretary, and then served two terms as national president, a responsibility that included negotiating each year's friendship tours with the Chinese government. She would always say that the highlight of this entire experience was the opportunity to take each of her sons on a tour to the land of her birth. She thought of herself as a teacher. For many years she led schools of mission across the conference and across the nation. She taught Elderhostel classes on China. She spoke to local chapters, elementary and secondary schools, and others on China issues throughout her time with USCPFA. In 1980 Tennessee Wesleyan College honored her for all her accomplishments with the honorary degree of Doctor of Humanities.

Yet throughout this active life, her center remained her home and family. She was a loving mother, a fine cook and homemaker, a talented seamstress and the person whose faithful attention to family ties helped bind together the several branches of her extended family. To her public life she brought a truly international vision of the worth of all peoples and an energetic, active approach to putting Christian values to work in the world. She was a strong, determined, gracious, caring, committed and eternally optimistic person whose memory will always be a blessing to her family and to the many others whose lives she touched.



RUTH FRYE WRIGHT

1925 – 2012

Ruth Frye Wright, age 86, of Chilhowie, VA, died on Wednesday, November 14, 2012, at the Wellmont Hospice House in Bristol, TN, after a brief illness. She was born in Saltville, VA, on December 22, 1925. On August 14, 1946, she married James Wright. Dad was an electrician with the Olin Chemical Company in Saltville. But in the middle of life, he answered a call to ministry. Mom was not only his lifelong companion, but also his partner in ministry. Early in her life, she worked as a beautician, but her greatest calling

was serving as a pastor's wife and sharing in the work of her husband.

That work included many small churches in the Saltville area as Dad served as a bi-vocational pastor while also working for Olin. When Olin closed in 1971, Dad went into ministry full-time, and they served three churches in the McClure, VA, area, and then the Morgan Memorial and Ingles Chapel United Methodist Churches in the Rose Hill, VA, area. In 1992, they retired and returned to their home area, settling in Chilhowie. Twice in retirement they were called back into service as Dad served as the Interim Pastor at the Madam Russell United Methodist Church in Saltville and at the Byars Cobb and Lebanon United Methodist Churches in Glade Spring following the death of their pastors.

Mom didn't make headlines or seek awards or recognition. She is remembered for her humble, caring, and loving spirit. In her funeral message I talked about "what I had learned from my momma" and said anyone who knew her saw these attributes in her life. Included were lessons of how to be humble, how to be funny and laugh, how to give, how to be caring, compassionate, and nurturing, and perhaps the four greatest attributes I learned from her: how to be tough, how to love, and how to have faith, and because of that faith, how to be content in all situations.

Mom's life evidenced all these lessons, especially as she continued to live alone in their home following Dad's death in 2007. By this point, she was legally blind and nearly deaf. Think about it. You can't read, you don't hear well, you really can't go outside and do much. It had to be a lonesome life. But she didn't become bitter or really complain. It shows the strength of her character and her determination. If Mom had claimed a motto, it would have been the words of the Apostle Paul: "I have learned to be content with whatever I have. I know what it is to have little, and I know what it is to have plenty. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being well-fed and of going hungry, of having plenty and of being in need. I can do all things through him who strengthens me."

Mom, who was greatly loved and is deeply missed, was preceded in death by her husband of 61 years, Rev. James Wright, her parents Enoch and Bertie Frye, one sister, Jeanette Frye Johnson, and brother-in law Garnett.

She is survived by sons, James M. Wright, Jr. (Jimmy) of Huntsville, AL, and the Rev.
