How you can help the victims of Katrina

Holston Conference, which includes your church as well as 914 other United Methodist congregations, is currently focusing on collecting single-bed air mattresses, new undergarments, paper products, diapers, and women's hygiene products. Church members are also asked to give money to United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR), which is our denomination's chief disaster-relief agency.

Why these particular items?

UMCOR does not work to provide disaster relief on its own but in cooperation with a larger group called Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD). Other members of VOAD include, among others, the American Red Cross, America's Second Harvest, Catholic Charities USA, and the Salvation Army. To ensure that a variety of needs are met following a disaster, each organization has its own relief "assignment." UMCOR serves a specific niche in the massive Hurricane Katrina relief effort, and each United Methodist conference is asked to help UMCOR meet those needs.

After consulting with UMCOR for the most current needs, Holston Conference has a new assignment as of Sept. 12. In this second wave of hurricane-relief donations, Holston churches are asked to collect the following:

- Single-bed air mattresses
- New undergarments for all ages, genders, and sizes
- Paper products (cups, napkins, plates, paper towels)
- Diapers for both children and adults
- Women's hygiene products

In the first wave of Holston's hurricane-relief donations, churches were asked to collect bottled water, blankets, and health kits. These items will still be accepted.

How will these items be delivered?

All of these items should be delivered to your district's designated collection point. Consult the "District Drop-Off" list (on the back page) and either call or e-mail your district office to get the latest information about where you should drop off supplies. Holston Conference is arranging for several trucks to deliver the goods continuously throughout the coming weeks – as long as churches will collect them, and as long as there is a need.

How can I donate money?

One hundred percent of the money that you give to UMCOR is used for relief efforts. You can donate to UMCOR through your church – simply by placing your check in the offering plate on Sunday morning. Make your check to your local church (i.e., "First United Methodist Church") or make it to "Holston Conference." Write "Hurricanes 2005" on the memo line. Your church treasurer will send the money to Holston Conference, and then the conference office will immediately send your money to UMCOR.You can also make credit-card donations by calling (800) 554-8583 or online at *http://methodistrelief.org*.

How can I find out more?

Holston will also be sending other supplies and work teams to the affected area in the weeks and months ahead. If you are interested in participating on a work team, you will need to receive training first. Within a week or two, the conference will announce work-team training opportunities.
